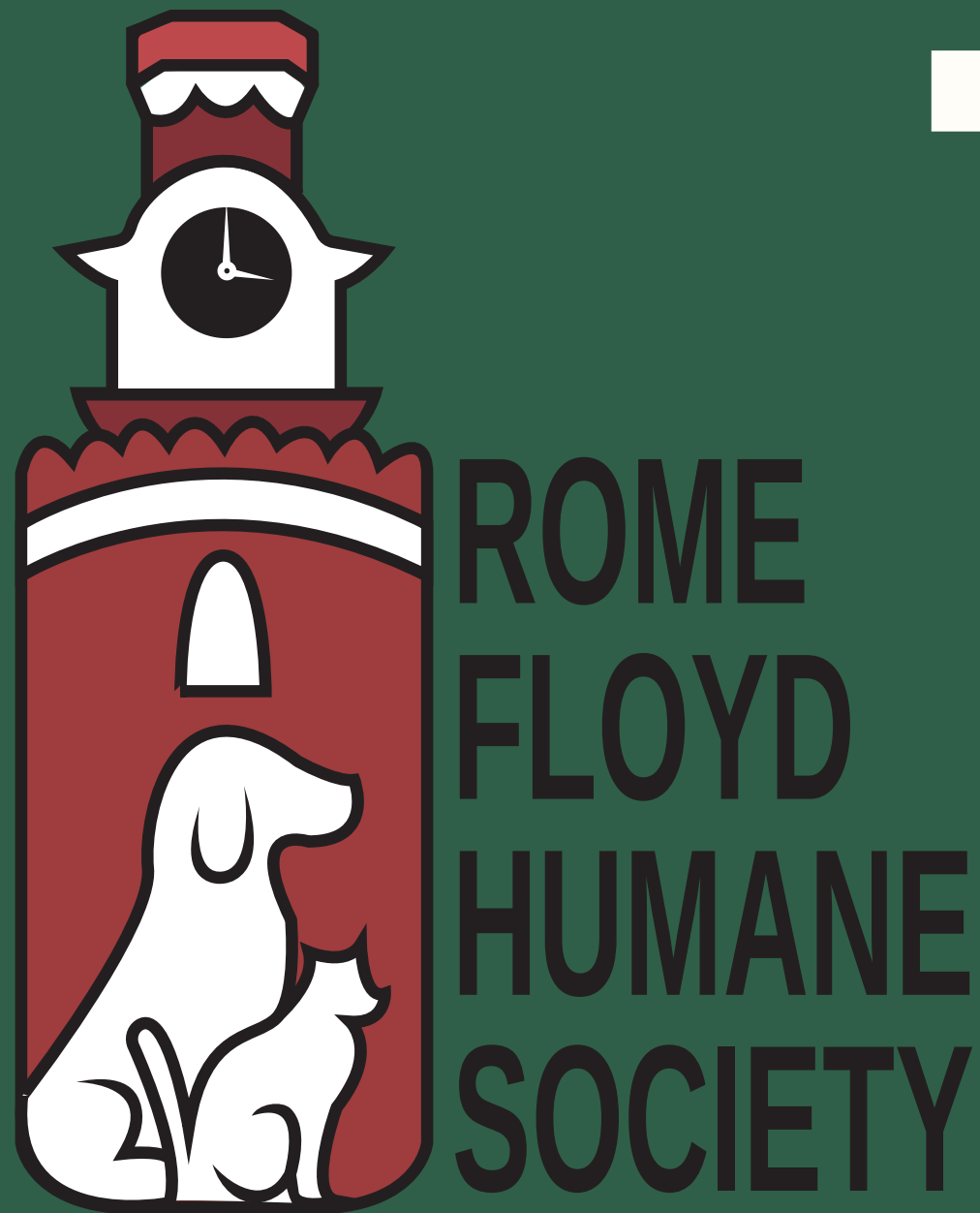

Everyone gets wet food and dry food and don't forget fresh water!

Don't forget to add probiotics

We have high standards for keeping our kitties well. We clean every kennel health in mind.

- Don't forget to use RESCUE spray on all surfaces except for food/water bowls
- We steam clean our floors at least once week to prevent viruses (you can help with that!) because clean floors are critical to kitty health
- Our instructions are on our checklists, but if you see something that needs doing, by all means, do it!

Socialization:



01 Our Kitties all arrive in home with EXTRA love already. This part is critical to their happy lives and to their new families as they all adjust. Spend as much time as you can playing, touching, and loving them.



02 Our cats are well socialized because we value a PEACEFUL environment so bring your most emotionally regulated self to your shift. If your children are part of your volunteer team, our expectation is that they will bring peace with them as well. Stress brings illness.

03 Anytime you see a kitty struggling with behavioral issues, immediately report that behavior to the GroupMe chat and to Leigh Bishop.
